

Call for nominations for 2024 AACI Young Scientist Award

Nominations are now open for the AACI Young Scientist Award. The AACI Young Scientist Award recognizes individuals those who have made outstanding achievements and important contributions in scientific research, technological invention, system development and application promotion in the field of artificial intelligence and perceptual cognitive technology. AACI accepts both nominations and self-nominations for the AACI Young Scientist Award, and the AACI award can also identify the potential candidates for the award.

Eligibility

1. The Young Scientist Award recognizes young scholars under the age of 40 for the year of nomination.
2. The award is awarded annually, and the number of domestic and foreign winners is not more than 5 each year.

Award Benefits:

In addition to receiving the AACI Outstanding Young Scientist Award certificate, the awardees will enjoy the following benefits:

- (1) Membership Benefits: Recipients of the AACI Outstanding Young Scientist Award will be directly granted the AACI Distinguished Member status.
- (2) Conference Benefits: Recipients of the AACI Outstanding Young Scientist Award will be invited by the management committee, as needed, to join the NCAA and ICCI conferences as Program Chairs or invited speakers. Additionally, award recipients who submit papers to NCAA and ICCI and have their papers accepted will receive a 30% discount on registration fees.
- (3) Promotion Benefits: The AACI will promote the award winners through the official AACI website, the official conference website, the AACI public account (with 5,000 followers), and the conference discussion group (with 1,500 members).

Deadline

Deadline for nominations – ***May 31, 2025***

Submissions

The nomination/self-nomination materials should include the following 5 parts:

1. Nomination basic details: Nominee name, affiliation, address, email, AACI membership number (if available). If the award is nominated by other people, please provide the nominator name, affiliation, address, email.

2. Nomination letter or reasons for self-nomination supporting the application (1 page).
3. List of representative publications in journals and conference proceedings as first author or corresponding author, which should be able to reflect personal research ability.
4. List of international services to the community of artificial intelligence and perceptual cognitive technology.
5. Justification of the nomination that describes the outstanding achievements of the nominee (max 3 pages).
6. Brief CV of the nominee.

Items 1-6 must be compiled into ONE pdf document for upload to the requested email.
